
Justice, Peace and Life

Jubilee 2025: Announcing a Year of Favor from the Lord



From the Vatican's web site www.iubilaeum2025.va:

"Jubilee" is the name given to a particular year; the name comes from the instrument used to mark its launch. In this case, ... the yobel, the ram's horn, used to proclaim the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur). This (Jewish) holiday occurs every year, but it takes on special significance when it marks the beginning of a Jubilee year. ...[which] was intended to be marked as a time to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation, and involved the forgiveness of debts, the return of misappropriated land, and a fallow period for the fields.

In <u>SPES NON CONFUNDIT</u> (Hope Does Not Disappoint), Pope Francis' document declaring 2025 a Jubilee year, the Holy Father calls us to be signs of hope in these times, particularly to prisoners on death row and other incarcerated people, to migrants, to the young, and to the elderly.

One step we can take right now is to **speak out for the 40 men in our federal prison system condemned to death**. Catholic Mobilizing Network has an **online petition** at this <u>link</u> to ask President Biden to commute their sentences. In 2021, President Biden established a moratorium on federal executions. However, it's expected that will end with the next administration, and federal prisoners will again be put to death.

Please **urge President Biden to commute their sentences**. This is not the same as a presidential pardon. It would simply mean that their sentences would be reduced from capital punishment to life in prison.
