Our staff report that children lack food and water, mothers cannot feed their infants, and families lack the most basic shelter. Recent aid convoys entering Gaza meet only a tiny fraction of the humanitarian need for two million Gazans. The humanitarian funding in this supplemental request is urgently needed. "Lord, we pray to you for the Holy Land, for the people of Israel and Palestine who are under the grip of unprecedented violence, for the victims, especially the children, for the wounded, for those held hostage, for the missing and their families.

In these hours of anguish and suspension, we join our voices to that of the Pope and to the choral prayer of those around the world who implore peace.

November is Native American Heritage Month

Did you know that Native Americans born in the United States were not granted U.S. citizenship until **1924**? Though the Fifteenth Amendment, passed in 1870, granted all U.S. citizens the right to vote regardless of race, it wasn't until the Snyder Act that Native Americans could enjoy the rights granted by this amendment. However it still took over forty years for Native Americans to have the right to vote in all fifty states. The Constitution left it up to the individual states to decide who had that right. Even with the lawful right to vote in every state, Native Americans suffered from the same mechanisms and strategies, such as poll taxes, literacy tests, fraud and intimidation, that kept African Americans from exercising that right.
